

The Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program

The Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program provides free screening services to women who:

- ★ Are 40 to 64 years old.
- ★ Qualify financially.
For example, a single woman must have a **weekly** income of less than \$412; a family of 4, less than \$848.
- ★ Do NOT belong to an HMO or have Medicare Part B.

Screening services include:

- ★ Clinical breast exam
- ★ Mammogram
- ★ Pelvic exam
- ★ Pap test
- ★ Patient education
- ★ Other related tests, if needed
- ★ Referrals to specialists, if needed
- ★ Notification of results
- ★ Yearly re-screening

For most women, test results bring peace of mind.

Hundreds of women enjoy peace of mind following normal annual Pap tests and mammograms. However, if these tests show an abnormality, it is important to get medical follow-up.

If found early and treated, the survival rate for breast and cervical cancer is very high.
